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Related What is the history of Falun Gong?

The answer, in short, is that Falun Gong was created by a middle school degree factory worker in Northeastern China, who claimed he was born in the same era with Buddha and Confucius.

Falun Gong's true origin, or let's say Falun Gong's "ancestor", could be Southeastern China's folk religions.

As the historical record states about the Kingdom Chu and its custom during the warring state period and even prior to that, its population was very into Gods and Devils worship (the "devil" one is named due to a lack of English translation).

Although there weren't enough details regarding that, one could indeed read from the records way later, for instance during the Song Dynasty, that the population there still had a similar kinda worship.

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Related What is the difference between Buddhism and Falun Gong systems?

Buddhism is a religion that has been practiced in Inida, China, Japan, Korea, Thailan, Viet Nam etc for over two thousand years.

Falun Gong is a cult created by Li Hongzhi who claimed to be the "buddha". His theory is somewhat partly based on Buddhism but in fact, they have almost nothing in common. Li simply just took some of the Buddhist terms (like Falun for instance) and concepts of modern science like galaxy and lighyear (which in Falun Gong is an unit of time) and "re-defined" them.

As to the Falun Dafa itself, it's not harmful per se but it is based on pseudo science and misconceptions so I do not recommand anyone who has a brain to practice Falun Gong.

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Related How does Falun Gong relate to other religious, spiritual, or philosophical movements in China?

Falun Gong is a "qi gong" practice (you can think of qigong as the Chinese version of yoga). Unlike most qigong practices, it has spiritual teachings. Practitioners are taught that being a kinder, more honest and tolerant person in daily life makes the meditative exercises more effective and improves your mental and physical health. The teachings sometimes talk about or explains Buddhist or Daoist concepts or stories, since those are the traditional religions in China, but its not a religion and is not related to the religion of buddhism or daoism.

Related Why is Falun Gong called a cult? What is the relationship between Shen Yun and Falungong?

Because its behavior is the same as the cult.

- 1 'When I was in Edinburgh, I received many propaganda from Falun Gong practitioners. They claimed that the Chinese ruling party had picked 300 million Falun Gong followers. Regardless of how large the operative workload was (the number was one-fourth of China's total population at that time), the problem was that organ transplants required very difficult organ matching and could not be preserved for a long time. I really can't think of any use of such a large number of organs.
- 2 'In China, there are indeed many examples of people who lost their lives because they believed in Falun Gong. This is not only from government propaganda but from the family and neighbors of my friends. Attacking government agencies, picking up traffic and self-immolation (self-burning themselves, in some pamphlets, Falun Gong propaganda will not cause any pain for it to burn itself), giving money to falungong and sexual assault. I do not know what religious doctrine will be so cruel, except for cults.
- 3 'Qigong is not equal to Falun Gong. The fact that Falun Gong was formally developed from China is only a matter of nearly two decades. It is nothing but a very unobtrusive branch from a school of Qigong in the south of China. In essence, it is even born in the branch called "around the tree stump". Even so, he was originally supposed to be one of the many magical magics in the world that is difficult to prove.
- 4 'However, such a religion that has shown little effect, In a short span of ten years, a great number of believers have been enthralled (it is interesting that these people even have great public opinion abroad. Do you not find it strange?) I cannot think of any religion other than cults that can have such power. In fact, Qigong comes from Taoism in China. However, Taoism has a teaching that it does not initiate missions. This is a lot different from the Falun Gong you mentioned.
- 5 'Falun Gong's leaders claimed to be Jesus, God, and Buddha, and proclaimed that they had saved mankind more than once. I can't think of any kind of religion in the end. And in the early brochures, there will be many of them meeting with Chinese leaders, thus preventing such propaganda as the Earth's explosion. This is clearly a psychological hint for the Chinese people, especially those with low levels of education. I can't think which kind of religion will do this other than cults.
